An identity system is defined as: A visual system of design that leverages common characteristics of related elements to create a unique, memorable, and distinguishable "identity." Identity systems represent a solid conceptual idea, summarized in a logo.

An identity system however encompasses much more than just a logo. Because it's a visual reflection of who you are and what you represent, every piece of promotional material that you produce should reflect and reinforce the same visual characteristic s. Well-designed identities convey strong visual messages by mainta ining consistency.
